### Parents Evening

Thanks for supporting your child's education by attending the Parents Evening and Stay and Play sessions (Early Years). It demonstrates the value our families place on education and their children's development. At the event, we hope you found the information board useful. For example, previously parents had asked for clarification on how our 'dot card' system works so they knew the reasons why children are recognised for their attitude, effort, hard work and progress. Every child is different and they are working at different abilities and starting points, which is one reason why they are awarded dots for different things. We also hope you picked up word lists to work on at home.

### Music at All Saints

Our Rock Band that meet afterschool on Wednesdays are performing in a showcase on 7<sup>th</sup> February and we have a Live Music show being performed for the children on 8<sup>th</sup> February.

### Supervision and Playground Activities before school

Please can I ask for your co-operation before school for the safety of all users of school. At this time of year when it is not possible to go on the school field as it is water logged, there is limited space for children, parents, grandparents and younger siblings in pushchairs for us to allow games of football at this time. I completely understand that the children love to play football and that the physical exercise is a great way to start the day however, there have been 'near misses' where the footballs have been kicked towards or into the crowds.

Once the field is accessible again, this ceases to be a problem as there is plenty of space on the field which reduces the clusters of people on the hard surface on the playground. It is only a short wait before children are let into school and they have full opportunity to play football at break time and lunchtime so I ask for your patience and understanding to be fair to everyone.

Also, can I take this opportunity to remind parents and children that we have a stock of school footballs so children are asked not to bring their own harder, caser balls into school as again in confined spaces and in a mixed age environment they are not suitable and we have never allowed caser footballs into school. Thank you for your support on this one.

### John Muir Award

The John Muir award is an environmental award which our very own Mr McGarvey is now qualified to run at our school. There are 4 stages to the award; **discovery, explore, conserve and share**. We plan to open up gaining the award, in the first instance to our families. You are invited to sign up at a cost of £50 per family to work with each other and Mr McGarvey to take part in the award over 4 days over the February half term break in the school grounds.
